- 1. Remember that the windows, doors and HVAC units are the tenant's responsibility. If you decide to use plywood to secure your space, you will be responsible for all damage to the exterior from use of nails, screws, etc. ✓ If you intend to board up the windows, please do not attach the wood to the metal window frames. Instead, attach the wood to the area in which the caulk is on the perimeter of the frame. Another method is to cut the wood 1/4 inch longer than the size of the window and to wedge it by putting the piece of plywood underneath the soffit and wedging it against the sidewalk. ✓ If you intend to tape your windows, the tape should be on the inside of the space. Understand that the tape will do little to prevent windows from breaking. This will only minimize damage and injury caused by flying glass and debris, which has to be cleaned up later. ✓ Your HVAC technician should check your units to make sure the panels are properly secured. 2. Please be advised that the shopping center does not carry insurance for the tenants' personal contents. Please keep your insurance policy handy.
